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During the COVID-19 crisis, insecurity of employment, economic uncertainty, the increase in unpaid care and education responsibilities, and domestic violence have had a more profound impact on women than men. Therefore, a regression threatens to undo years of progress towards gender equality and related achievements, such as the reduction of economic disparities and the construction of more inclusive and fair societies.

Previous crises, however, have already transformed behaviour patterns, attitudes, and inequalities related to gender. From Antiquity onwards, the past offers various case studies where political, economic, cultural, or environmental crises have transformed gender roles and identities, with numerous consequences for women. Analysing these phenomena and their effects is crucial to reaching a more thorough and critical understanding of current inequalities, as well as facing the changes that are inevitably going to take place in the following years on a global scale.

The workshop “Crises and Gender Inequalities from the Present to the Past” offers a space for this urgent reflection. It explores several past and present crises from a humanistic, interdisciplinary, and gender perspective. Its papers will focus on how gender roles and attitudes have suffered reconfigurations during or after a crisis. Between 5 and 7 October, the workshop will welcome internationally-recognized researchers to UPF’s Ciutadella Campus, to understand and face present gender inequalities by searching for interpretation clues in the past.
